IGCSE ENGLISH LITERATURE

Our Literature Students explore a wide variety of texts via a combination of examination and coursework

IGCSE ENGLISH LANGUAGE

Our Language Students explore the world of non-literary texts from all over the English speaking world, again via a combination of examination and coursework

Paper 1 Exam:

Transactional Writing - writing for a purpose

Reading Comprehension - based on a non-fiction text

Unseen Extracts

Anthology Extracts (10 extracts - taken from a variety of cultures and genres)

The Coursework:

- Creative Writing Task
- Critical Essay on two Anthology Texts

The iGCSE intends pupils to:

- develop their knowledge and understanding of mathematical concepts and techniques
- acquire a foundation of mathematical skills for further study in the subject or related areas
- enjoying and applying mathematical techniques and concepts, and become confident in using mathematics to solve problems
- appreciate the importance of mathematics in society, employment and study

IGCSE MATHEMATICS (9-1)

Foundation - Grades achievable 1-5

Higher - Grades achievable 3-9

There are two examination papers that are 2 hours each and both papers require a suitable scientific calculator.

IGCSE PHYSICS

GRADES 9 - 10

Scientific knowledge, concepts and skills are assessed using the following weighted categories:

Formal assessments, (FA) 80%
Practical Skills, (PS) 10%
Continual assessments, (CA) 10%.

The final year grade is calculated using the following weighted grades:
first semester 40%,
second semester 40% and final exam (EX) 20%.



IGCSE BIOLOGY

All students take 2 IGCSE science courses : Biology and Chemistry or Physics and Chemistry

These IGCSE courses are assessed externally :-

Theory Examination Composed of 2 written papers,

PAPER ONE –

- The paper is assessed through a 2-hour written examination paper set and marked by Pearson.
- The total number of marks is 110.
- A mixture of different question styles, including multiple-choice questions, short-answer questions, calculations and extended open-response questions.
- A calculator may be used in the examinations.



IGCSE CHEMISTRY

PAPER two –

- The paper is assessed through a 1-hour and 15-minute written examination paper set and marked by Pearson.
- The total number of marks is 70.
- A mixture of different question styles, including multiple-choice questions, short questions, calculations and extended open-response questions.
- A calculator may be used in the examinations.




THE CHOICE PROCESS

Students will make their selections via a Google Form which opens at 5pm on Monday February 18th

Students must be logged in to their St Andrew's gmail account before completing the choice form. They should indicate which subjects they would like to choose.

Students will indicate a first and second choice in each group.

Courses will be filled on a first come, first served basis. Submissions are time-stamped to ensure fairness.




- An engaging and accessible programme to all

When final external exam certificates are issued by Edexcel, Grades 8 and 9 may be awarded for exceptional performance.

The course provides both a foundation for further study at the **IB Business and Management Level** and an ideal preparation for the world of work.








We study **two in depth** studies:

FEES





BGCSE MUSIC

Students will reinforce all theory components learned in the middle school and be introduced to technical degrees, the alto and tenor clefs, major and minor scales up to four sharps and flats, triads, chords and cadences.

Students listen to and analyze works from various composers, focusing on characteristics used within certain time periods.

Students will learn skills in performing their own choice pieces, conducting, repetition and sight-reading.

IGCSE PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Cambridge IGCSE Physical Education is accepted by universities and employers as proof of knowledge and understanding of Physical Education. The Cambridge IGCSE Physical Education syllabus encourages learners to develop:

- Knowledge, skills, and understanding of a range of relevant physical activities
- An ability to plan, perform and evaluate physical activities
- An understanding of effective and safe performance
- An understanding of the role of sport and physical activity in society and in the wider world
- An excellent foundation for advanced study, such as, Kinesiology, Physiotherapy, Sports Medicine
- An enjoyment of physical activity

Physical Education

All pupils at St Andrew's follow a core PE programme based on the following aims:

Students will look at how to learn. The focus will be on study skills, lifelong learning and self-improvement.

CAS (Creativity, Activity and Service)

Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS) is an integral part of all Secondary School programmes at St Andrew's. The CAS programme at St Andrew's continues throughout both years of grades 9 and 10. An element of all three components is required each year. Each student develops a programme in consultation with their Learning Advisor and Head of House, allowing for a reasonable balance between creativity, activity and service.

Students usually fulfil the requirements of the programme by combining participation in extra-curricular activities offered at the school with service to the school or larger community. Suitable activities engaged in privately outside the school can also be part of the CAS programme, if they are undertaken regularly and can be evaluated by a teacher or other responsible adult.
